Monochromatic Sunset

Project Objective(s): My job for this project is to use what I've already learned about color, the creation of colors (color mixing), color values, and color meanings to critically think about the use of colors and apply that to express a desired feeling in my work. By the end of this project, I will be able to create a painting using one color and all of its tints and shades, making a monochromatic painting of a sunset. I will be able to complete the painting by adding the landscape details; all of this being based on the color I've chosen's meaning to express my desired feeling.

Materials/Tools:

#2 Pencil
B/W Sunset Picture
Acrylic Paint (1 color – your choice)
White and Black Acrylic Paint
Paintbrushes/Water Cups/Mixing Trays

Vocabulary:

Hue – the name of a spectral color (example: red) **Monochromatic** – One Color. A monochromatic color scheme used only one hue (color) and the values, tints, and shades of that hue for a unifying effect

Tint – a light value of a hue made by mixing the hue with white

Shade– a dark value of a hue made by adding black to it **Landscape** – a painting or drawing in which natural land scenery, such as mountains, trees, rivers, or lakes, is the main feature

Helpful Hints, Warnings, and Insights:

- Make sure your color choice and landscape setting/image go together make sure they are a good "fit"
- Make sure your paint goes all the way to the edge of the paper
- You will need PERSERVERANCE, PERSISTENCE, AND PATIENCE
- SLOW DOWN!!! With the details!!!!
- Make sure you take your time adding all the fine details of your landscape!!!
- You must include ALL of the details from the landscape picture in your drawing You must get permission before you add, omit, or change anything in your painting that is not in the landscape picture

Procedures:

- Get the handouts on Color Symbolism and Color Meanings
- 2. Pick the color you are going to use based on that color's meaning and/or symbolism
- 3. Fill out the Monochromatic Sunset Color Choice paper
- Pick out you sunset picture that corresponds with your color choice's meaning
- 5. Create the color you are going to use for your background color
- 6. Mix to the lightest tint of that particular color
- 7. Start in the middle –or- wherever you want your "sun" to be create a circle with the lightest tint
- Add more of the actual color to the mixture and then begin painting – circulating to the outside as you go
- Repeat this until you get back to the original color, then start adding black to create the tints
- 10. Keep adding black to the mixture as you paint in a circular motion to the edges or border line
- 11. Let the background paint dry
- 12. Using BLACK acrylic paint, paint in the scenery part of your sunset picture EVERY DETAIL
- 13. Complete your Monochromatic Sunset Reflection Paper
- Grade your project and turn the grading rubric in WITH the reflection


