#### **Rhythm Sculptures – Tradition Hispanic Dance Abstract Sculptures**

Project Objective(s): My job for this project is to create an abstract design using lines, colors, and shapes based on my Tradition Hispanic Dance Music/Song. I will then turn my abstract/music/ song design into a 3D abstract sculpture that is sturdy enough to stand up all on its own. By the end of this project, I will have created an abstract designed sculpture that visually represents the music and a song that corresponds to my chosen Traditional Hispanic Dance.

#### Vocabulary:

**Abstract Art**  $-20^{\text{th}}$  Century art containing shapes that simplify shapes of real objects to emphasize form instead of subject matter

**Formalism** – Art Theory: An aesthetic and critical theory of art that places emphasis on form; the structural qualities instead of either content or contextual qualities. According to this point of view, the most important thing about a work of art is the effective organization of the elements of art through the use of the principles of design.

Kandinsky – 20th Century Artist, pioneer of abstract art- was one of the first creators of pure abstraction in modern design. His forms evolved from fluid and organic to geometric and, finally, to pictographic. Kandinsky strove to use abstraction to give design the freedom from nature that he admired in music.

**Sculpture** – A three-dimensional (3-D) work of art, or the art of making it. Such works may be carved, modeled, constructed, or cast. Sculptures can also be described as assemblage, in the round, and relief, and made in a huge variety of media.

- Remember to have your designed signed off on BEFORE you start cutting it up to create your sculpture
- Get CREATIVE AND INVENTIVE!!
- Only Abstract Designs (no Realism or Surrealism)
- SLOW DOWN!!!
- Be very careful with the Hot Glue Gun Avoid burning yourself!
- Misuse of any kind with the hot glue gun and you will not be allowed to use it & may be written up for your actions.
- X-ACTO Knives will be available for use Be very careful with the X-ACTO Knife – Avoid cutting the table or yourself
- Misuse of any kind with the X-ACTO Knife and you will not be allowed to use it & may be written up for your actions.

Step 4: Research Packet – DEIGN PLANNING (Using: Markers)

Start to plan out your DESIGN composition – should include in Kandinsky's abstract feeling - such as using the Elements and Principals, color, line, shapes (and angles), contrast, and emphasis but making one complete design, one complete thought but should explicitly show your chosen SONG and the movement of the dance through the Elements and Principles you use.

Step 10: Research Packet – Sculpture PLANNING
Plan out your SCULPTURE – What is it going to look like from
the front, side, other side, back, and top.

Have your sculpture plan checked over by Mrs. Green before starting cutting up your drawing

Cut up your abstract design and sculpting the pieces together (REMEMBER: HOLD the pieces in place for at least 30 seconds to allow the glue time to start to dry – Hot Glue Gun: be VERY careful not to burn yourself. CAREFULLY press the glue into the seams of the pieces)




