Materials Needed:

- Digital Camera
- Access to a Student Computer
- ➤ 8 BEST "Point of View" compositions: 2 High POV, 2 LOW POV, 2 EYE LEVE, 1 Bird's Eye or Worm Level, 1 Artist's Choice

Directions:

- Brainstorm which subjects and locations on campus might be most interesting to create "Point of View" compositions.
 - You CAN use the Lego Photographer but you do not HAVE to.
- After you have taken all of your photographs, upload all of your photos to the computer, our Class Google drive, Production Team Folder, and then separate the photos out into your individual folders.
- Edit your photos on the computer as needed. Crop, rotate, change settings, etc.
- 4) Create a Digital Critique sheet. Refer to the directions already provided.
- 5) Save your Digital Critique Sheet to your student folder Google drive.
- 6) Open Google classroom.
- Go to the assignment and TURN IN your digital critique sheet before the deadline.
